BRONX WOMAN INDICTED IN FATAL STABBING OF BOYFRIEND **Victim Stabbed Multiple Times**

Bronx District Attorney Darcel D. Clark today announced that a Bronx woman was indicted on second-degree Murder and related charges for allegedly stabbing her boyfriend to death.

District Attorney Clark said, “An argument between a couple escalated with deadly consequences. The defendant is accused of stabbing her boyfriend multiple times, causing his death. We will get justice for this victim’s family.”

District Attorney Clark said that defendant Dulce Dayana Hernandez Jimenez, 28, of Perry Avenue, the Bronx, was arraigned on May 12, 2026, on second-degree Murder, first-degree Manslaughter and fourth-degree Criminal Possession of a Weapon before Bronx Supreme Court Justice Audrey Stone. Hernandez Jimenez was remanded and is due back in court on July 29, 2026.

According to the investigation, in the afternoon of March 28, 2026, the defendant and her boyfriend, Ramon Vasquez 35, argued in front of 3210 Webster Avenue. Hernandez Jimenez allegedly slapped Vasquez and they dispersed. Around 9:45 p.m., Hernandez Jimenez returned to the same location and another argument ensued, and she allegedly took out a butterfly knife and stabbed Vasquez multiple times, including once in the chest. Vasquez was taken to St. Barnabas Hospital where he died.

The case is being prosecuted by Assistant District Attorney Megan Leo, of the Domestic Violence Bureau, under the supervision of Simon Folkard and Jena Rizzo, Deputy Chiefs of the Domestic Violence Bureau, Agata Digiovanni, Chief of the Domestic Violence Bureau, and under the overall supervision of Adrienne Giunta, Deputy Chief of Special Victims Division and Joe Muroff, Chief of Special Victims Division.
